


Regulatory ecosystem in India



PSS are being increasingly used to demonstrate compliance to **regulation** in India (Food Safety authority/ AYUSH CoPP/Yoga - Recruitments)



How we understand PSS





Why India is weary

- Technical Barrier to Trade
- Compliance difficulty
 - readiness
 - alien concepts
 - foreign contexts
 - complex interpretation
 - long term investment
 - no interoperability among PSS
- Lack of harmonization
- No access to funds and unclear timelines to encourage PSS adoption
- Fear of losing focus on domestic market while eyeing exports








Statement on PSS in Developing Countries



- Joint Statement on PSS developed by QCI
- 4 developing economies agreed to sign the Joint Statement for taking collective action towards PSS

Asia-Pacific Forum on Sustainable Development



- Negotiated PSS related clauses in Final Recommendations of the Asia-Pacific Forum on SD
- Country statement on Indian PSS Platform and achieving SDGs through trade



The suggested "Way Forward' for the World

- Every economy must identify a single body for PSS
- Conformity Assessment process must be harmonized and agreed
- *Maturity model* approach for other economies as long term strategy
- Conduct India-wide survey on PSS in product groups
- Portal for PSS-related info for local & public procurement, and consumers



The 'Way Forward' for the World (contd.)

- PSS must be followed with an action plan to the Government to provide wide ranging incentives like:
 - ✓ Making PSS pre-requisite for local & public procurement
 - ✓ Access to funds for upgradation
 - Access to global markets
 - Reduction in oversight for local laws
 - ✓ Reduction in oversight in technical regulations
 - ✓ Deemed compliant status for PSS adherence
