The Committee will conduct its seventh annual review under Article 15.3 of the Agreement at its meeting on 20 March 2003. This document contains information on developments in the implementation and operation of the Agreement during the period from 1 January to 31 December 2002.

1.2 Main developments of the Committee during the current period

The Committee held its twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth and twenty-ninth meetings on 15 March, 20-21 June and 17 October (G/TBT/M/26-28) respectively. At those meetings, the Committee heard statements concerning the implementation and administration of the Agreement, technical assistance and observer status. A number of Members informed the Committee of measures taken to ensure the implementation and administration of the Agreement. Several measures were brought to the attention of the Committee by Members who raised concerns about the potential adverse trade effects or inconsistency with the Agreement of those measures. The OIE, WHO, UNCTAD and the UN/ECE were invited to update the Committee on their technical assistance activities and on the ways in which they sought to ensure effective participation of Members, in particular developing country Members in their activities.

At its twenty-seventh meeting, the Committee carried out its Seventh Annual Review of the Implementation and Operation of the Agreement under Article 15.3 as well as its Seventh Annual Review of the Code of Good Practice for the Preparation, Adoption and Application of Standards (Annex 3 of the Agreement) based on background documents G/TBT/11/Rev.2, WTO TBT Standards Code Directory (Seventh Edition), G/TBT/CS/1/Add.6 and G/TBT/CS/2/Rev.8. It considered a number of proposals made at the Special Meeting on Procedures for Information Exchange held on 28 June 2001, and agreed to prepare a booklet on transparency provisions of the Agreement.

Following the Second Triennial Review of the Operation and Implementation of the Agreement under Article 15.4 (G/TBT/9), the Committee continued discussions on a number of elements taken up during that Review. It continued to develop a demand-driven Technical Cooperation Programme as confirmed and mandated by Ministers at Doha. A questionnaire for a survey to assist developing country Members to identify and prioritize their specific needs in the TBT-field was prepared (G/TBT/W/178). Fifty developing country Members submitted responses to the questionnaire for the consideration of the Committee. (Job(02)/99 – Job(02)/99/Add.49).

At its twenty-eight and twenty-ninth meetings, it proceeded to carry out the mandate provided by Ministers at Doha to address the outstanding implementation issues. At its twenty-ninth meeting, it carried out the annual transitional review mandated in the Protocol of Accession of the People's Republic of China

III. NOTIFICATIONS

3.1 Notifications made in the current year and since the entry into force of the agreement by Members and by the relevant Articles of the Agreement

In 2002, Members submitted 581^4 notifications. Since the entry into force of the Agreement on 1 January 1995 up to 31 December 2002, 4666 notifications have been made by 73 Members. Articles 2.9, 2.10, 3.2, 5.6, 5.7 and 7.2 were specified in 4129, 155, 3, 359, 50 and 3 notifications respectively. 121 notifications did not refer to any Articles.

VII. CODE OF GOOD PRACTICE FOR THE PREPARATION, ADOPTION AND APPLICATION OF STANDARDS

Since the entry into force of the Agreement, 139 standardizing bodies from 101 Members have adhered to the Code of Good Practice. Notifications of acceptance of the Code by standardizing bodies of Members are contained in documents G/TBT/CS/N/1-150⁹. Document G/TBT/CS/2/Rev.9 contains the complete list by Member of standardizing bodies that have accepted the Code since 1 January 1995. A list of standardizing bodies adhered to the Code in 2002 is contained in document G/TBT/CS/1/Add.7. In 2002, 10 standardizing bodies from 10 Members have accepted the Code, and six bodies from one Member have withdrawn from the Code.

The eighth edition of the WTO TBT Standards Code Directory is published by the ISO/IEC Information Centre in February 2003.
